TEAM DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Q1: Part of our role, as leaders, is a responsibility to invest in the next generation of leaders for the future of the church of Canada. How are you, as a leader or an organization, setting up the next generation for success?

ACTION STEPS

Our identity is in Christ and not in our success and wins. We need to take this mentality and mindset when we are pouring into the next generation of leaders. It is so important to remind them that their identity and their mission needs to solely be placed in Christ. Take time to pray into your next-generation leaders. Pray into their identity and encourage them that who they are in Christ is more important than the wins and success of a ministry area, numbers, etc.
